• Leading up to this activity, students will read a variety of articles/documents on different careers during our intervention time. They don't have to do any research or make any decisions beforehand; it is just to expose students to the wide variety of available careers.

Introduction

T: Good morning, students! Today we are going to step away from what we normally talk about and instead discuss some careers you can have after high school. Let's take a minute to jot down as many careers as you can.

**Set a minute time and have students record as many careers as they can. Then have them share what they came up with their table groups

T: Great job recording careers that you all thought of and sharing with your table groups. I heard some awesome discussions. Now what we are going to do is take a career quiz to figure out some careers that might be good for you

T: I am going to show you step by step what you are going to do then you will get the opportunity to take the quiz and do some research on your own.
