Lesson Title	My Future Career	
Suggested Lesson Time	One 50-minute class period	
Lesson Objectives	 Performance: Students will take a career interest inventory and investigate one career in each of the three recommended career clusters, or three careers in one cluster if the RIASEC inventory is used. 	
	 Condition: The students will use the HirePaths.com website to research jobs that would suit their interests. 	
	 Criteria: Students will answer questions about each career they investigate using the table/worksheet.

- Using a projector screen, do a walk-through of the website and worksheet for a sample career to model the assignment for the students.

Assignments

- Students will complete a career interest inventory; Xello could also be used, or data from Xello could be used if available.
- Students will research three careers in their recommended cluster(s).

Introduction

Introduce the lesson by talking about how what we like to do and how we act (our personalities) can often impact what career we decide to pursue. Many options are available, so we need to do some research and learn about them.

The teacher should display the HirePaths website on a projection screen and show the students all the resources on the site. The teacher could feature a Cool Careers episode to launch the lesson and begin the discussion. The students will then complete an interest inventory and begin their research of three potential careers.

Summary

The students will share one of the careers they researched with a group. Each person will reflect on the careers they researched in a group discussion. Students can share about the most interesting things they learned.
