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Let students know you'll take one step at a time. Try not to get overwhelmed looking at the entire project as a whole—save that for the celebration at the end. This project works best in baby steps, and this is just the beginning!

Student Activities

There are MANY learning opportunities throughout the publishing project. Brainstorming, drafting, editing, finalizing and sharing all take time (and patience!), but it's worth it.

Extension activities:

- Bring in other authors before/during/after the publishing process
- Share your book with HirePaths!
- Find a sponsor to help purchase copies of the book for every student
- Take a field trip to a local assisted living facility and have students read their written and illustrated portion; students can also interview residents about their career(s)
